A BALANCED FUEL MIX PROMOTES POWER RELIABILITY

he energy industry is undergoing a dramatic transformation as consumer demand for more renewable energy sources grows, and innovation and technology continue to advance exponentially. You're likely witnessing this energy evolution firsthand.

In driving across the region, you may have noticed fields of solar panels owned by Highline Electric Association and other utilities, along with an increase in solar panels on your neighbors' roofs. Maybe you've heard about the impending changes in the transportation sector with most major vehicle companies announcing plans to offer more electric vehicles at more affordable prices.

Consumer interest in renewable energy is strong and growing. In addition, national studies indicate that consumers have an expectation that companies operate in an ethical and responsible manner — including when it comes to the environment.

At Highline, we have always put the good of our community first. While our primary function is to provide reliable and affordable energy to our consumer-members, we are more than an electricity provider. 

Rebates must be requested within <u>120 days</u> of the purchase date (not install date), so don't wait. Call us or go online today!





Water Safety Reminder

hough important year-round, July is a good time to talk about water safety. Life vests, fire extinguishers, flotation devices that can be thrown in the water and proper lighting are a few essentials for recreation at a pool or a lake. But some people aren't aware of one of the most dangerous and life-threatening hazards that can kill swimmers without warning: electric shock drowning. ESD can occur when electrical connections around pools, lakes and other bodies of water are not installed or maintained properly.

Safe Electricity urges boat owners to have dockside electrical systems installed by professional electricians guided by the National Electrical Code, and to have these systems inspected regularly to avoid tragedy. Get more information about ESD by visiting SafeElectricity.org.
